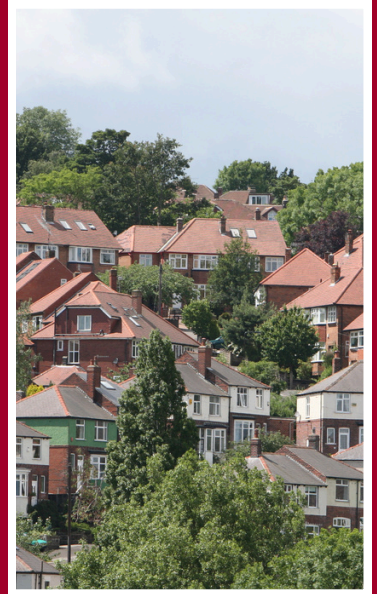


PRIDE IN SHEFFIELD

CUT THE COST OF LIVING TO SUPPORT FAMILIES

WHAT WE'VE DONE

Cutting the cost of living

- Reduced the number of families in temporary accommodation.
- Brought the tram back under public control and cut fares.
- Introduced the free Sheffield Connects city centre bus.

Homes and jobs

- Introduced a new housebuilding plan ensuring affordable homes in every development, with most built on brownfield land.
- Improved council housing repairs and reduced empty homes between tenancies.
- Completed the Heart of the City regeneration, bringing jobs, investment and the award-winning Pound's Park.
- Increased council contracts awarded to Sheffield businesses.
- Introduced a fairer council housing allocations policy including a local connection requirement.

Cleaner, safer streets

- Introduced a Public Space Protection Order in the city centre to tackle anti-social behaviour.
- Strengthened enforcement against littering and dog fouling.
- Reduced air pollution and invested in new electric buses.

Pride in our neighbourhoods

- Managed council finances responsibly.
- Introduced the Sheffield Women and Girls Safety Charter.
- Worked with residents on regeneration plans for Gleadless Valley.
- Raised £1m through Sheffield's first Climate Bond for solar panels on schools.
- Invested in new play and community facilities at Hillsborough Park.
- Relunched the Sheffield Legends scheme celebrating people who inspire our city.
- Two children's homes received Outstanding Ofsted judgements.
- Develop community action plans with residents in Parson Cross, Southey and Fox Hill, and in Batemoor, Lowedges and Jordanthorpe through the £40m Pride in Place programme.

Standing for unity

- Challenged racism and hate and celebrated Sheffield's diversity, supporting events like Kelham Pride and hosting the first Iftar at Sheffield Town Hall.

Homes, jobs and investment

- Increase council house building and improve existing homes.
- Continue regenerating Castlegate and create a new city centre park.

- Introduce a new Ethical Procurement Policy prioritising sustainable and local businesses.
- Increase council house building and improve existing homes with new roofs, kitchens and bathrooms.
- Bring derelict brownfield land back into use, with new neighbourhoods at Neepsend and Attercliffe.

Cleaner, greener city

- Improve recycling with larger blue bins for every household.
- Hold Yorkshire Water to account for pollution and leaks.
- Introduce a Lane Rental scheme to fine utility companies delaying roadworks.
- Put solar panels on over 30 primary schools to cut their energy bills

Stronger communities

- Begin rebuilding Springs Leisure Centre, named after Uriah Rennie.
- Deliver free community events across the city.
- Develop community action plans with residents in Parson Cross, Southey, Fox Hill, Batemoor, Lowedges and Jordanthorpe.
- Open a new medical centre at Spital Street in Burngreave.
- Oppose racism, hate and those people who seek to divide us.
- Deliver free community events across the city to bring people together and celebrate our diversity.

School streets

- Introduce new school streets to improve road safety.

WHAT WE WILL DO BY 2028

- Bring buses back under public control in 2027.
- Continue to roll out free breakfast clubs to every primary school.
- Invest £10m in new SEND hubs in schools.
- Expand apprenticeships and training opportunities for young people.
- Begin building new neighbourhoods at Furnace Hill and Neepsend.
- Expand Climate Bonds for so residents can invest in renewable energy projects.
- Use new powers to tackle pavement parking.
- Begin rebuilding Concord Leisure Centre and refurbish Hillsborough and Ponds Forge.
- Host the Tour de France Femmes in 2027.
- Work with employers to expand apprenticeships and training opportunities for young people.
- Celebrate 20 years of Sheffield as the UK's first City of Sanctuary.
